The current 4-H program year is October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023. Rodeo age requirements vary slightly from other 4-H programs and can be found in the NM 4-H Rodeo Rule Book on the NM 4-H Website. *While the 4-H Cloverbuds program is a component of the overall 4-H Youth Development program and 4-H Cloverbuds members are recognized as 4-H members for the purposes of enrollment, they are considered to be in a special membership category with regard to programs and policies.

Good Standing

Members, parents and leaders, do you know exactly what 4-H members need to do to be in "good standing"? Do you know what the "good standing" requirements are? If not, please take a moment to check these out now. Don't wait until before the fair (or other events/activities) when you may not have enough time to meet the requirements.

Remember, a 4-H member in good standing is one who has met the following requirements: --Enrolls in a 4-H Club by February 1, 2023.

--Attends at least 40% of all club meetings held between October 1, 2022 and the date of the event or activity. Some 4-H Clubs require members to attend at least 50% of club meetings. So, be sure to check with your 4-H club leader for the minimum number of club meetings you are required to attend to be considered in "good standing".

--Follows the NM 4-H Conduct and Behavior Expectations of Youth and Adults.



4-H Project Materials


In 4-H, there are numerous projects available to members. Projects include animal science, gardening, photography, foods, clothing, public speaking, creative arts, Cloverbuds and more. A complete list of projects is available on the NM 4-H website. Project materials are available for each 4-H project which include manuals and record forms. Members receive materials by enrolling in the project and requesting materials from the Otero County Extension Service. Leaders may also request project materials to facilitate 4-H project meetings.

Many of the 4-H project materials are available as a digital file (free of charge). In Otero County, the first three printed project materials are provided free of charge to 4-H members and any additional projects cost \$4.00 each. There is no deadline for adding a project to your enrollment during the 4-H program year.

Community Service Scholarship applications are due two (2) months before the event registration deadline:

> All 4-H members interested in participating in 4-H opportunities involving their horse must complete a 4-H Horse Certificate and submit it to the Extension Office by May 1, 2023. The 4-H Horse Certificate may be obtained from the Extension Office or the NM 4-H website

4-H Rodeo Consent Forms

All 4-H members planning to participate in 2023 NM 4-H Sanctioned Rodeos must complete a "4-H Consent and Assumption of Risk for Participation in Rodeo Activities" form and submit the form to the Extension Office. Once the forms have been received in the Otero County Extension Office, the Extension Office Staff will submit the forms to the State 4-H Office (Las Cruces). Forms must be completed and submitted prior to a 4-H member's participation in a 4-H rodeo which includes the signature of your 4-H Club Leader. Please don't wait to submit your completed form to the Extension Office, if you plan to participate in 4-H rodeos this year submit your completed form ASAP! The rodeo form can be obtained from the NM 4-H website along with additional information regarding NM 4-H sanctioned rodeos (rule book, dates of rodeos, entry forms, and more). Contact the Extension Office if you have questions regarding 4-H rodeos.

Shooting Sports Youth Summit



Shooting Sports Youth Summit will be held on March 24-26, 2023, at the NRA Whittington Center in Raton, New Mexico. The event will be open to Senior Age 4-H members enrolled in a 4-H Shooting Sports Project. The Summit will be limited. Applications will be due by February 17th in the Extension Office and the cost will be \$200.00 per participant and will include housing and meals at the Whittington Center.

The activities throughout the weekend will be a "hands-on" approach. Each individual will have an opportunity to be exposed to all the shooting sports disciplines offered in the New Mexico 4-H Program and will learn safety and

techniques to teach and help other youth in those areas. Leadership activities throughout the weekend will allow youth to become spokespersons and ambassadors for the New Mexico 4-H Shooting Sports Program and take what they have learned back to their County to be an asset to the program.

This is not an event to develop better shooters, but is a leadership event based around the 4-H shooting sports projects and to develop state-wide ambassadors for the program. The application process will give more weight to leadership activities than shooting sports activities.

Counselor-in-Training (CIT) – any 4-H member who is at least 13 and in the 8th grade or 14 years old may apply. The CIT will work with a counselor in planning activities and leading either a novice or junior age group during the event.

Counselor – any senior that is 15 years old may apply. The counselor will work with a CIT in planning activities and leading either a novice or junior age group during the event.

A 13-year-old who is in the 8th grade or a 14-year-old can only apply to be a CIT. If an applicant is 15, even if this is their first year applying, they must apply to be a counselor
