The current 4-H program year is October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024. Rodeo age requirements vary slightly from other 4-H programs and can be found in the NM 4-H Rodeo Rule Book on the NM 4-H Website.

*While the 4-H Cloverbuds program is a component of the overall 4-H Youth Development program and 4-H Cloverbuds members are recognized as 4-H members for the purposes of enrollment, they are considered to be in a special membership category with regard to programs and policies.

4-H Good Standing Requirements

Members, parents and leaders, do you know exactly what 4-H members need to do to be in "good standing"? Do you know what the "good standing" requirements are? If not, please take a moment to check these out now. Don't wait until before the fair (or other event/activity) when you may not have enough time to meet the requirements.

Remember, a 4-H member in good standing is one who has met the following requirements:

--Enrolls in a 4-H Club by February 1, 2024.

--Attends at least 40% of all club meetings held between October 1, 2023, and the date of the event or activity. Some 4-H Clubs require members to attend at least 50% of club meetings. So, be sure to check with your 4-H club leader for the minimum number of club meetings you are required to attend to be considered in "good standing".

County 4-H Council Officer Elections

What: 2023-2024 Otero County 4-H Council Officer Elections

When: October 17, 2024, 6:30pm

Where: Otero County Extension Office, 401 Fairgrounds Rd, Alamogordo

Who: Otero County 4-H members, all 4-H clubs may have four (4) voting delegates

Who can run for office:

- 1. Any active Otero county 4-H member who is a Novice, Junior, or Senior at the time of the elections may submit an application.
- 2. Candidates must turn in an application to the Extension Office by October 15, 2024. Application forms are available from the Extension Office or the <u>Otero County Extension website</u>. You may either mail the form, bring it by the office, or fax it into the office (fax #575-437-6134). We will not take phone applications. The form requires signatures of 4-H applicant, parent, and 4-H Club Organizational Leader.
- 3. The applicant may specify up to three (3) office choices he or she wishes to run for.
- 4. All candidates will be required to present a brief speech, no more than 3 minutes in length, prior to the election of officers during the October 17th Council Meeting. Candidate speeches should include information about why you want to become an Otero County 4-H Council Officer, experiences you have had that will make you an effective council officer, and any other information you feel is relevant.
- 5. If elected as an officer, you are expected to perform all office duties to the best of your ability and according to the bylaws.

Otero County 4-H Record Books

Record keeping is an important life skill, and all 4-H members are encouraged to keep written records of their 4-H club year. These records are turned into the Extension Office each year and evaluated. Each member receives helpful feedback and may receive an award for their effort and achievement. Record Book judges will select 4-H members for the following awards:

- Outstanding Novice 4-H Member
- Outstanding Junior 4-H Member
- Outstanding Senior 4-H Member
- Leadership Award (Senior 4-H Members Eligible)
- Novice 4-H Member Project Awards
- Junior 4-H Member Project Awards
- Senior 4-H Member Project Awards

County 4-H Record Book <u>forms</u> and <u>guidelines</u> may be downloaded from the Otero County Extension website. The website has everything you need to know about assembling your 4-H Record Book and submitting it for judging. Be sure you are working on your record book in order to have it ready to turn in to the Extension Office by the October 17th deadline.

4-H Awards Nominations Wanted!

The Meritorious Award and Outstanding 4-H Leader Award will be awarded through a nomination process. Later this year, during the annual 4-H Awards Ceremony, Otero County 4-H Council will provide the following awards:

- Outstanding 4-H Leader Award- an adult volunteer that is an enrolled 4-H Leader in Otero County and has demonstrated outstanding service and contribution to the Otero County 4-H Program.
- Meritorious 4-H Award- an Otero County group, organization, business, or individual, **outside** of 4-H, who throughout the years has donated significantly of their time and effort to the Otero County 4-H Program.

We need 4-H members, leaders, and parents to submit nominations for these awards. Nomination forms are due in the Extension Office by September 16, 2024, and can be obtained from the Extension Office or the <u>Otero County</u> Extension Service website.

Nominations received by the deadline will be reviewed by Otero County 4-H Council prior to the annual 4-H Awards Ceremony.

Enrollment Changes and Meeting Attendance

Please contact the Extension Office, (575) 437-0231, if you would like to make a change to your 4-H enrollment. This includes changing to a different club, adding/dropping 4-H projects, updates to your contact information, etc. 4-H members will only receive credit for attending 4-H meetings via the club they're enrolled in through Zsuites. 4-H youth enrolled in multiple 4-H clubs must meet the attendance requirements of all clubs they are enrolled in to be considered in good standing.

FCS Lettermen

(Deadline Extended to September 27th)

Any 4-H member who is active in Family and Consumer Sciences Projects may "letter" in Family and Consumer Sciences. All that is necessary to "letter" is to complete the requirements in their age level and submit the appropriate forms to the Otero County Extension Office by **September 27th**. A member must be enrolled in 4-H for at least two years in their respective age division and FCS projects (and other related projects). The first year a member letters they receive a "clover" letter as you would see on a lettermen jacket. Bronze, Silver, and Gold pins in the shape of the letter "H" are awarded in the respective age levels. A member can "letter" at any time, even if they did not begin as a Novice, but they will receive the pin for the appropriate age level.

In addition, two platinum letters will be awarded each year. The platinum letters are based on overall achievement and may be received at any age level. Platinum awards are selected from all applications submitted in that 4-H program year. For information on how to "letter" and appropriate application forms, refer to the NM 4-H website.

NM 4-H Community Service Scholarship

The NM 4-H Community Service Scholarship provides financial assistance to any Novice, Junior, or Senior 4-H members participating in a state 4-H event (examples: Senior Leadership Retreat or Youth Get-Away). The scholarship will cover the registration expenses for the state 4-H event. In addition, the scholarship also provides \$250 of the team fees for Senior 4-H members serving as a State 4-H Officer or Ambassador. A complete description of the scholarship criteria and an application form can be obtained from the NM 4-H website. A list of scholarship application deadline dates is also included on the website.

Heritage 4-H has had a great year! Our members have learned new skills in many different types of projects. Many members competed in 4-H contests and met new friends. We are excited for the fair season to begin. Our club will begin the new 4-H vear in October!



4-H Volunteer Leader Enrollment Reminder

This is a friendly reminder for adult volunteers interested in serving as 4-H volunteer leaders with Otero County 4-H, the following requirements for enrollment must be met:

- 1. Complete volunteer background check/screening process. Forms (2) may be downloaded from the <u>Otero County Extension Service website</u>. Submit completed forms and \$10 to the Otero County Extension Office.
- 2. Complete and submit an <u>adult enrollment form and adult liability form</u> to the Otero County Extension Office.
- 3. Complete the annual NM Working with Minors course. Contact the Extension Office, 575-437-0231 or otero@nmsu.edu, for a detailed set of instructions for completing this online training course. Once you have completed the training, an email will be sent to you stating that you have completed the NM Working with Minors course. In addition, the Otero County Extension Service will be able to access your completion date of the NM Working with Minors training via Zsuite.

Please make completion of the above requirements a priority as adult volunteers may not engage in 4-H activities nor register for events until they have met the requirements. Also, adult volunteers must submit a new background check/screening process every five years.
