The current 4-H program year is October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2025. Rodeo age requirements vary slightly from other 4-H programs and can be found in the NM 4-H Rodeo Rule Book on the NM 4-H Website. *While the 4-H Cloverbuds program is a component of the overall 4-H Youth Development program and 4-H Cloverbuds members are recognized as 4-H members for the purposes of enrollment, they are considered to be in a special membership category with regard to programs and policies.

🗱 4-H Good Standing Requirements 🗱

Members, parents, and leaders, do you know exactly what 4-H members need to do to be in "good standing"? If not, please take a moment to check these out now. Don't wait until before the fair (or other event/activity) when you may not have enough time to meet the requirements.

Remember! A 4-H member in good standing is one who has met the following requirements:

- Enrolls in a 4-H Club by February 1, 2025.
- Attends at least 40% of all club meetings held between October 1, 2024, and the date of the event or activity. Some 4-H Clubs require members to attend at least 50% of club meetings. Be sure to check with your 4-H club leader for the minimum number of meetings you are required to attend to be in "good standing".
- Follows the NM 4-H Conduct and Behavior Expectations of Youth and Adults.

Enrollment Changes and Meeting Attendance

Please contact the Extension Office, (575) 437-0231, if you would like to make a change to your 4-H enrollment. This includes changing to a different club, adding/dropping 4-H projects, updates to your contact information, etc. 4-H members will only receive credit for attending 4-H meetings via the club they're enrolled in through Zsuites. 4-H youth enrolled in multiple 4-H clubs must meet the attendance requirements of all clubs they are enrolled in to be considered in good standing.

NM 4-H Community Service Scholarship

The NM 4-H Community Service Scholarship provides financial assistance to any Novice, Junior, or Senior 4-H members participating in a state 4-H event (examples: Senior Leadership Retreat or Youth Get-Away). The scholarship will cover the registration expenses for the state 4-H event. In addition, the scholarship also provides \$250 of the team fees for Senior 4-H members serving as a State 4-H Officer or Ambassador. A complete description of the scholarship criteria and an application form can be obtained from the NM 4-H website. A list of scholarship application deadline dates is also included on the website.

4-H Volunteer Leader Enrollment Reminder

This is a friendly reminder for adult volunteers interested in serving as 4-H volunteer leaders with Otero County 4-H, the following requirements for enrollment must be met:

- Complete volunteer background check/screening process. Forms (2) may be downloaded from the <u>Otero County</u> <u>Extension Service website</u>. Submit completed forms and \$10 to the Otero County Extension Office.
- Complete and submit an <u>adult enrollment</u> form and adult <u>liability form</u> to the Otero County Extension Office.
- Complete the annual NM Working with Minors course found on ZSuites. Contact the Extension Office, 575-437-0231 or otero@nmsu.edu, for a detailed set of instructions for completing this online training course. Once you have completed the training, an email will be sent to you stating that you have completed the NM Working with Minors course. In addition, the Otero County Extension Service will be able to access your completion date of the NM Working with Minors training via Zsuite.

Please make completion of the above requirements a priority as adult volunteers may not engage in 4-H activities nor register for events until they have met the requirements. Also, adult volunteers must submit a new background check/screening process every five years.

(Youth & Adult) require a liability waiver to be filled out and signed by hand (wet signature).



If you are not already a part of a shooting sports discipline and want to be, now is the time! According to the Otero County Shooting Sports County Plan found on our <u>site:</u>

- A minimum of four (4) practices must be attended prior to Otero County shooting sports contest during the current 4-H program year in that said discipline.
- 4-H members must attend at least one practice session between October 1st and March 1st in that said discipline to be eligible to participate in additional practice sessions scheduled during the 4-H program year.
- 4-H shooting sports members are responsible for signing in at each practice they attend.

The New Mexico 4-H FCS School is designed for 4-H members ages 9-12. 4-H'ers choose one track per year. Track size is limited and is first come first served. New this year; youth are invited to participate in FCS Carnival night on March 7th, 2025 at 6-8PM. The members will have the opportunity to participate in FCS contests and build friendships with other 4-H youth across the State. Dinner will be provided.

This year's track offerings are

- Baking
- QuiltingSTEAM
- Babysitting 101, First Aid/CPR (Juniors Only)
- Photography
- Outdoor Cooking (Juniors Only)
- Ceramics/Painting on Canvas
 - Creative Arts

Senior 4-H members may apply to serve as junior instructors. They will be under the direct supervision of the FCS School Instructors. Though they are not being paid, this should be considered as a job – junior instructors are expected to participate fully as directed by instructors and abide by all policies of the NM 4-H Program and this event. There is no registration fee if a youth is selected to serve as a junior instructor; however they are responsible for travel to and from the event. Junior Instructors will be provided more information about orientation and assigned track if selected.

Please note that this event is first come first served for the sign-up process, youth who sign up after spots have been filled will be added to a waitlist. Sign up forms have been emailed out and are due back to the extension office no later than February 17th.

4-H Sewing Projects

4-H sewing workshops will be held on Monday afternoons in February at the Otero County Extension Office. All Novice, Junior, and Senior 4-H members may participate in the sessions. If you are interested in participating in the sessions, please contact Kelly at the Extension Office, 575-437-0231 or kelknigh@nmsu.edu. Kelly will provide assistance to 4-H families for selecting a 4-H sewing project. Sewing options include garments, tote bags, aprons, quilts, to name a few. All sewing levels are welcome, beginners to advanced. Sewing machines will be provided for 4-H members to use or 4-H members may bring their own machines to the sessions. There is no fee for participating. However, 4-H members are responsible for purchasing some supplies such as fabric, thread, patterns, buttons, elastic, etc.

Last 4-H year we had a growing number of 4-H members participating in the sewing sessions. If the numbers continue to grow, we will need more adults to stay and assist 4-H members during the sessions. Parents are always welcome to attend the sewing sessions and help their child(ren). Parents do not have to be experts in sewing to help, they simply need to be willing to learn and help. The agent and volunteer leaders will provide direction and assistance to 4-H members during the sessions, but we may need additional adults to attend with their vouth. An adult who is an enrolled 4-H leader is welcome to assist any of the 4-H youth. Parents who are not enrolled 4-H leaders may assist their own child(ren) during the sewing sessions. We have 10 sewing machines available each week for sewing. If we have an occurrence of not having enough machines for the number of youth attending the sessions, then we may need to look at requiring 4-H families to RSVP for the sewing sessions.

The purpose of the 4-H sewing project is to provide 4-H youth with a lifetime skill. Youth will learn skills that can save them money throughout their lifetime. They can replace a lost button or sew a seam that ripped open. They will also gain self-confidence, patience, perseverance, problem-solving and they'll have an opportunity to express their creative side through sewing. 4-H'ers will enter their completed sewing items in the Otero County 4-H Achievement Day (usually scheduled in August) and may participate in 4-H Fashion revues (summer months).

Enrollment Instructions

The enrollment good standing deadline for all 4-H members, re-enrolling and new members, is February 1st, 2025.

4-H members must be enrolled on or before February 1, 2025, for 4-H members to be eligible to participate in county, district, and/or state level 4- H competitive events. All 4-H members must re-enroll every year. The Otero County Extension Service will accept enrollment forms after February 1, 2025, however members enrolling after February 1, 2025, are not eligible to participate in county, district and/or state level competitive events and will not meet the policy outlined in the Otero County 4-H Council Bylaws for 4-H members in good standing. Members enrolling after February 1, 2025, may participate in non-competitive events at the club, county, district, and/or state level at the discretion of the 4-H club.

4-H youth members have the option of submitting a paper enrollment or enrolling online via the ZSuite website. Paper enrollment forms are available from the Otero County Extension Office. For members submitting completed paper enrollment forms, they may be submitted to their 4-H Club Organizational Leader or to the Otero County Extension Office. 4-H Club Leaders receiving any completed enrollment forms from 4-H members must submit the forms to the Otero County Extension Office on or before February 1, 2025. 4-H members submitting enrollment forms to their 4-H Club Organizational Leaders or other individual are strongly encouraged to contact the Otero County Extension Office, 575-437-0231, to confirm that the forms have been received in the Extension Office by the deadline. If you would like to enroll via the ZSuite website, the website instructions for re-enrolling members and new members are as follows:

Re-Enrollment

- 1.Go to ZSuites online.
- 2.Log in to your account and select the primary profile. 3.Using the drop-down menu, enroll each applicable
- member (4-H members, adult volunteers).
 4.Complete To Do list ------
- 5. Click Submit

New Enrollment

- 1.Go to ZSuites online.
- 2.Click the Sign Up link.
- 3.Fillout the popup to create a new household. This is the Primary Parent account. Write down the pin code you create somewhere safe.
- 4. The email entered will be used as the family email for all members under the household account.
- 5. Click the "Let's Go" button when done.
- 6.On the Dashboard for the primary account, you can create new household accounts (4-H members, adult volunteers) through Household members.

Annual Enrollment TO DO: New & Re-enrolled

- Review/Update personal information section.
- Upload your completed NM 4-H Youth Medical & Liability Release/Code of Conduct Contract/Media Release Form 300.A-3 or submit your completed paper form to Otero County Extension Office, hand signed.
- Add your 4-H club (Please select only ONE 4-H club. 4-H members selecting multiple clubs will be required to meet the 4-H good standing requirements of all clubs they are enrolled in.)
- Add 4-H projects
- Payment is not required in ZSuite for enrollment in the Otero County 4-H program. (4-H Club membership dues need to be submitted directly to your 4-H club treasurer or organizational club leader.)
