The current 4-H program year is October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026. Rodeo age requirements vary slightly from other 4-H programs and can be found in the NM 4-H Rodeo Rule Book on the NM 4-H Website.

*While the <u>4-H Cloverbuds program</u> is a component of the overall 4-H Youth Development program and 4-H Cloverbuds members are recognized as 4-H members for the purposes of enrollment, they are considered to be in a special membership category with regard to programs and policies.

4-H Good Standing Requirements

Members, parents, and leaders, do you know what 4-H members need to do to be in "good standing"? If not, please take a moment to look now. Don't wait until before the fair (or other event/activity) when you may not have enough time to meet the requirements.

Remember! A 4-H member in good standing is one who has met the following requirements:

- Enrolls in a 4-H Club by February 1, 2026.
- Attends at least 40% of all club meetings held between October 1, 2025, and the date of the event or activity. Some 4-H Clubs require members to attend at least 50% of club meetings. Be sure to check with your 4-H club leader for the minimum number of meetings you are required to attend to be in "good standing".
- Follows the NM 4-H Conduct and Behavior Expectations of Youth and Adults.

NM 4-H Community Service Scholarship

The NM 4-H Community Service Scholarship provides financial assistance to any Novice, Junior, or Senior 4-H members participating in a state 4-H event (examples: Senior Leadership Retreat or Youth Get-Away). The scholarship will cover the registration expenses for the state 4-H event. In addition, the scholarship also provides \$250 of the team fees for Senior 4-H members serving as a State 4-H Officer or Ambassador. A complete description of the scholarship criteria and an application form can be obtained from the NM 4-H website. A list of scholarship application deadline dates is also included on the website.

Enrollment Changes and Meeting Attendance

Please contact the Extension Office, (575) 437-0231, if you would like to make a change to your 4-H enrollment. This includes changing to a different club, adding/dropping 4-H projects, updates to your contact information, etc. 4-H members will only receive credit for attending 4-H meetings via the club they're enrolled in through Zsuites. 4-H youth enrolled in multiple 4-H clubs must meet the attendance requirements of all clubs they are enrolled in to be considered in good standing.

How to become a volunteer!

This is a friendly reminder for adults interested in serving as a 4-H volunteer, the following requirements for volunteer enrollment must be met:

- 1. Complete volunteer background check/screening process. Forms (2) may be downloaded from the Otero County Extension Service website. Submit completed forms and \$10 to the Otero County Extension Office.
- 2. Complete and submit an <u>adult enrollment</u> <u>form</u> and adult <u>liability form</u> to the Otero County Extension Office.
- 3. Complete the **annual** NM Working with Minors course found on ZSuites. Contact the Extension Office, 575-437-0231 or otero@nmsu.edu, for a detailed set of instructions for completing this online training course. Once you have completed the training, an email will be sent to you stating that you have completed the NM Working with Minors course. In addition, the Otero County Extension Service will be able to access your completion date of the NM Working with Minors training via Zsuite.

Please make completion of the above requirements a priority as adult volunteers may not engage in 4-H activities nor register for events until they have met the requirements. Also, adult volunteers must submit a new background check/screening process every five years.



If you would like to participate in 4-H sewing sessions at the Extension Office, please contact Kelly Knight, FCS Agent, prior to attending your first sewing session. Kelly will help 4-H members choose their sewing projects and create a list of supplies they'll need (fabric, notions, patterns, etc.).

Who can participate in 4-H sewing sessions: All Novice, Junior, and Senior members are invited to participate.

Weekly sewing session schedule:

Sewing sessions will be held on Monday afternoons (following your school's scheduled release time) at the Otero County Extension Office (except on holidays).

Supplies and equipment:

Sewing machines will be available for members to use, or you may bring your own. There is no fee to participate. However, members are responsible for purchasing personal supplies such as fabric, thread, buttons, elastic, patterns, etc. All experience levels- beginner through advanced- are welcome. Project options include garments, tote bags, aprons, and quilts, among others. We currently have 10 sewing machines available. If attendance exceeds the number of available machines, we may begin requiring families to RSVP for each session.

Parent and volunteer involvement:

During previous years, we saw a growing number of youth participating in sewing sessions. If that continues, we may need additional adults to assist. Parents are always welcome to attend and help their child(ren)- no sewing expertise required! Guidance will be provided by the agent and volunteer leaders. (Note: Enrolled 4-H leaders may assist any participating youth. Parents who are not enrolled leaders may assist their own child(ren).) Any youth who attend 4-H sewing sessions without a parent must be able to use an iron independently.

Why participate:

The 4-H Sewing project helps youth gain lifelong skills-saving money by repairing clothing, building self-confidence, developing patience and problem-solving abilities, and expressing creativity. 4-H members will have the opportunity to enter their completed sewing projects in Otero County 4-H Achievement Day (typically held in August) and participate in 4-H Fashion Revues during the summer months.

Enrollment Instructions

The Otero County enrollment deadline for all 4-H members, reenrolling and new members, is February 1st, 2026.

4-H members must be enrolled on or before February 1, 2026, for 4-H members to be eligible to participate in county, district, and/or state level 4- H competitive events. All 4-H members must re-enroll every year. The Otero County Extension Service will accept enrollment forms after February 1, 2026, however members enrolling after February 1, 2026, are not eligible to participate in county, district and/or state level competitive events and will not meet the policy outlined in the Otero County 4-H Council Bylaws for 4-H members in good standing. Members enrolling after February 1, 2026, may participate in non-competitive events at the club, county, district, and/or state level at the discretion of the 4-H club.

4-H youth members have the option of submitting a paper enrollment or enrolling online via the ZSuite website. Paper enrollment forms are available from the Otero County Extension Office. For members submitting completed paper enrollment forms, they may be submitted to their 4-H Club Organizational Leader or to the Otero County Extension Office. 4-H Club Leaders receiving any completed enrollment forms from 4-H members must submit the forms to the Otero County Extension Office on or before February 1, 2026. 4-H members submitting enrollment forms to their 4-H Club Organizational Leaders or other individual are strongly encouraged to contact the Otero County Extension Office, 575-437-0231, to confirm that the forms have been received in the Extension Office by the deadline. If you would like to enroll via the ZSuite website, the website instructions for re-enrolling members and new members are as follows:

Re-Enrollment

1.Go to ZSuites online.

2.Log in to your account and select the primary profile. 3.Using the drop-down menu, enroll each applicable

member (4-H youth, adult volunteers).

4. Complète To Do list -----

5.Click Submit

New Enrollment

1.Go to ZSuites online.

2.Click the Sign Up link.

3. Fillout the popup to create a new household. This is the Primary Parent account. Write down the pin code you create somewhere safe.

4. The email entered will be used as the family email for all members under the household account.

5. Click the "Let's Go" button when done.

6.On the Dashboard for the primary account, you can create new household accounts (4-H youth, adult volunteers) through Household members.

- Payment is not required in ZSuite for enrollment in the Otero County 4-H program. (4-H Club membership dues need to be submitted directly to your 4-H club treasurer or organizational club leader.)
