The current 4-H program year is October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2025. Rodeo age requirements vary slightly from other 4-H programs and can be found in the <u>NM 4-H Rodeo Rule Book</u> on the NM 4-H Website. *While the <u>4-H Cloverbuds program</u> is a component of the overall 4-H Youth Development program and 4-H Cloverbuds members are recognized as 4-H members for the purposes of enrollment, they are considered to be in a special membership category with regard to programs and policies.

🍀 4-H Good Standing Requirements 🍀

Members, parents, and leaders, do you know what 4-H members need to do to be in "good standing"? If not, please take a moment to look now. Don't wait until before the fair (or other event/activity) when you may not have enough time to meet the requirements.

Remember! A 4-H member in good standing is one who has met the following requirements:

- Enrolls in a 4-H Club by February 1, 2025.
- Attends at least 40% of all club meetings held between October 1, 2024, and the date of the event or activity. Some 4-H Clubs require members to attend at least 50% of club meetings. Be sure to check with your 4-H club leader for the minimum number of meetings you are required to attend to be in "good standing".
- Follows the NM 4-H Conduct and Behavior Expectations of Youth and Adults.

NM 4-H Community Service Scholarship

The NM 4-H Community Service Scholarship provides financial assistance to any Novice, Junior, or Senior 4-H members participating in a state 4-H event (examples: Senior Leadership Retreat or Youth Get-Away). The scholarship will cover the registration expenses for the state 4-H event. In addition, the scholarship also provides \$250 of the team fees for Senior 4-H members serving as a State 4-H Officer or Ambassador. A complete description of the scholarship criteria and an application form can be obtained from the NM 4-H website. A list of scholarship application deadline dates is also included on the website.

Enrollment Changes and Meeting Attendance

Please contact the Extension Office, (575) 437-0231, if you would like to make a change to your 4-H enrollment. This includes changing to a different club, adding/dropping 4-H projects, updates to your contact information, etc. **4-H members will only receive credit for attending 4-H meetings via the club they're enrolled in through Zsuites.** 4-H youth enrolled in multiple 4-H clubs must meet the attendance requirements of all clubs they are enrolled in to be considered in good standing.

How to become a volunteer!

This is a friendly reminder for adults interested in serving as a 4-H volunteer, the following requirements for volunteer enrollment must be met:

- 1. Complete volunteer background check/screening process. Forms (2) may be downloaded from the <u>Otero County</u> <u>Extension Service website</u>. Submit completed forms and \$10 to the Otero County Extension Office.
- 2. Complete and submit an <u>adult enrollment</u> <u>form</u> and adult <u>liability form</u> to the Otero County Extension Office.
- 3. Complete the **annual** NM Working with Minors course found on ZSuites. Contact the Extension Office, 575-437-0231 or otero@nmsu.edu, for a detailed set of instructions for completing this online training course. Once you have completed the training, an email will be sent to you stating that you have completed the NM Working with Minors course. In addition, the Otero County Extension Service will be able to access your completion date of the NM Working with Minors training via Zsuite.

Please make completion of the above requirements a priority as adult volunteers may not engage in 4-H activities nor register for events until they have met the

requirements. Also, adult volunteers must submit a new background check/screening process every five years.

> All 4-H enrollments (Youth & Adult) require a liability waiver to be filled out and signed by hand (wet signature). No typed signatures will be accepted!

Any 4-H member, Leader, Parent/Guardian, or Volunteer may submit a youth (from any Otero 4-H club) for a Member of the Month nomination. To nominate, submit the following info directly to Hannah at hdw@nmsu.edu by the 20th of each month:



Otero County 4-H Council: Community Service in Action

The Otero County 4-H Council has proudly engaged in two meaningful community service projects this year.

Earlier this year, council members came together to create fleece dog toys for the Otero County Animal Shelter. This hands-on activity not only provided cozy and fun toys for shelter animals but also allowed 4-H youth to contribute to the wellbeing of pets waiting for their forever homes. In addition, the council chose to use funds to support local cancer patients at the CHRISTUS Health Clinic. Members shopped for comfort items and small activities to help patients pass time during treatment. These items were donated in a way that allows individuals to choose what suits them best, offering a personal touch during challenging moments.

Through these projects, Otero County 4-H members have shown the power of teamwork, empathy, and leadership. Their actions continue to reflect the 4-H pledge: "hands to larger service," and make a lasting impact in the lives of people and animals throughout the county.



Otero County 4-H proudly participated in Ag Day at the New Mexico School for the Blind and Visually Impaired on May 8th, bringing agriculture to life through sensory-rich experiences. One family brought a bottle calf, allowing students to interact with the animal and explore the tools used in its care. Two additional 4-H members volunteered to lead hands-on discussions on topics such as plant and insect identification, livestock tools, feedstuffs, and general agricultural practices. The focus was on engaging all five senses to create meaningful, inclusive learning moments. Students were able to touch, smell, and hear various elements of agriculture in action. This was a unique and rewarding outreach event, and we're grateful to our volunteers for making it a success!

Prepare Your Indoor 4-H Project Exhibits

The exhibit classes for indoor 4-H project exhibits have been updated and are now available from the <u>Otero County Extension Service</u> <u>website</u>. The date for the Otero County 4-H Achievement Day (viewing of exhibits and awards) will be **August 16th, 2025**. Details regarding entry of exhibits, viewing schedule, and awards presentation will be announced in future newsletters.

There are several updates to the exhibit classes and a complete list of updates can be downloaded from the <u>Otero County Extension Service</u> <u>website</u>. As you prepare your 4-H exhibits for the Otero County 4-H Achievement Day, be sure to follow the standards outlined in your 4-H project books and the *Indoor 4-H Project Exhibits Rules and Class Descriptions*. 4-H members entering indoor 4-H project exhibits at the Otero County 4-H Achievement Day are eligible to win many awards.

4-H Project Materials

In 4-H, there are numerous projects available to members. Projects include animal science, gardening, photography, foods, clothing, public speaking, creative arts, Cloverbuds and more. A complete list of projects is available on the <u>NM 4-H website</u>. Project materials are available for each 4-H project which include manuals and record forms. Members receive materials by enrolling in the project and requesting materials from the Otero County Extension Service. Leaders may also request project materials to facilitate 4-H project meetings.

Many of the 4-H project materials are available as a digital file (free of charge). In Otero County, the first three printed project materials are provided free of charge to 4-H members and any additional projects cost \$4.00 each. 2024–25 NM 4-H & FFA Livestock Project Animal Ear Tags

All New Mexico Fair Tags (NMF) for 4-H & FFA livestock project animals will be NM State 4-H issued, electronic USDA 840 series tags per species. New Mexico Fair (NMF) tags are only available through NM County Extension Offices. NMF tags are to be placed in the appropriate ear of each members designated project animal(s) for the current show season at an official 4-H / FFA tagging, within the County or School District of 4-H or FFA membership, by a NM County 4-H Agent / Designee, or FFA Instructor.

2025 Junior Livestock DNA and Nomination Procedures

ALL MARKET animals including Dairy Replacement Heifers will be required to submit a DNA sample, excluding Breeding Heifers, Jr. Wether Doe & Jr. Commercial Ewe. NMSF recommends that the County Agent or Teacher pull the sample. If someone other than these officials will be pulling the sample, please be sure to identify that person on the collection envelope. Be sure to tag the animal's ear before taking the sample.

Instructions for taking the DNA samples are as follows: 1. Fill out the information on the collection envelope.

2. Using clean pliers pull out 30-40 dry hairs. The follicles must be intact.

 Place the hair sample in the collection envelope and seal it.
 The packets MUST be signed by the exhibitor, parent and extension agent. They will NOT be accepted if there is a signature missing.



- Coverage applies to animals to be shown at 4-H and FFA county or state fairs that are owned by active club or chapter members in the United States, Puerto Rico and Canada. Specialty breeds and show animals are not included.
- Livestock that can be insured are those animals valued at \$2,500 or less in the following categories:
 - Beef animals for feeding
 - Beef and dairy animals for breeding
 - Hogs for feeding and breeding
 - Lambs for feeding and breeding
 - Goats for feeding
 - Goats for dairy and breeding
 Each animal must be identified with
- Each animal must be identified with a tattoo, brand, registration number or other identifier.
- Maximum amount of insurance is up to each animal's actual cash value not to exceed policy limits.
- The animal must be at least 30 days old.
- Coverage is written on an annual basis and not renewable.

- Coverage applies for loss by death from any cause other than what's excluded. Notable exclusions are:
 - Neglect to provide proper care or treatment.
 Medication given, including drugs, vitamins, hormones and proteins, unless administered by
 - a licensed veterinarian to treat an injury, illness or disease
 Surgery, unless certified and performed by a
 - Surgery, unless certified and performed by a veterinarian to save the animal's life. Prior company approval is not necessary for any surgical procedure performed to save an animal.
 Seizure or destruction by order of governmental authority.
- The premium for all livestock is \$11 per \$100 of the insured animal's value.
- There's no refund of premium when an indemnity payment is made or upon cancellation or reduction of coverage.
